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A Note From The LatAm Director



Dear Members,

Philanthropy is in the process of evolution. We have seen a very large movement of changes and advances in world philanthropy, and it is no different here in Latin America, where changes have been happening as well. The Latin philanthropy sector (motivated by the impacts of the pandemic, the political and the economic challenges) was quick to respond to all the social and environmental challenges. It has expanded the sense of coresponsibility and increased the number of partnerships between philanthropy and civil society who are both in the search for solutions.

And with that, we have expanded the relevance of Synergos in the region too. Contributing to the local agenda with various collaborations, strategic partnerships and strengthening civil society in the region. Here, we have invested in training the new generation of philanthropists, supporting the development of our GPC members and especially exploring partnership opportunities among GPC members.

This effort has led to the Collective Action for the Amazon collaborative community, formed essentially by members of the new generation of philanthropists. Together they are investing in a project in the Amazon region, which strengthens the link between the indigenous population and the economy of the forest. Given that our social and environmental challenges have a very global and interdependent component, the GPC represents an immense opportunity for members to explore.

For example, the issue of refugees is global, it impacts Latin America as well as Europe, just like how the challenges of the Food System are global and demands that different actors and nationalities together seek solutions. This goes on to show the potential of our global network to provide and facilitate dialogue and opportunities for collective action to elevate the potential and strategy of philanthropic action.

These are examples that are worth exploring by GPC members and our networks across Europe, the USA, Asia and Latin America are open to dialogue with you to help you find opportunities for collaboration with those who have concerns close to yours. Offering spaces for collaboration, dialogue, joint construction and expanding the impact of your philanthropy is a commitment of our entire team.

Dr. José Luiz Setúbal on Philanthropy, Impact of Covid-19 and More

Tell us about your philanthropy, where does it come from and what does it mean to your life?

Philanthropy is a Family Value. Since 2004, I have dedicated myself to philanthropy through my Foundation and since 2010, I have fully dedicated myself professionally to philanthropy as well.

Over the last 18 years I have progressively stopped treating children in my clinic and dedicated myself more to the management and construction of Fundação José Luiz Egydio Setúbal (FJLES) and the consolidation of the Sabará Hospital. This work ended up being recognized and I was invited to participate in several boards of social organizations and even ended up being invited to solve the problems of Santa Casa de Misericórdia de SP, the largest philanthropic hospital in Latin America.

For my life it means working to strengthen the civil society in search of a more equal and better world for all the inhabitants of this planet.

Tell us about the Fundação José Luiz Egydio Setúbal, for what purpose was it created and how have you been operating?

The FJLES maintains the Sabará Children's Hospital, now considered one of the leading pediatric hospitals in South America. It generates resources for our endowment and serves as an internship, teaching and research field for the Pensi Institute, which is our arm responsible for managing social projects.

Our purpose is "a healthy childhood for a better society". We believe that through medical assistance, research, education and teaching in children's health we will be able to help inform public policies, train health professionals, generate and disseminate knowledge to improve the health of our children and adolescents, and thus be able to build a better society.

Is there synergy between your business, your family, and philanthropy? The hospital provides the funds for the endowment of the foundation, would that be a connection?

Yes, the hospital is not philanthropic. It is part of the Brazilian supplementary health system. Its financial result, which is quite large, is deposited in the endowment. This was the sustainability model imagined for the FJLES.

Our endowment grows annually with the financial results and with the results of the hospital, which is in an expansion phase with plans to more than double its capacity over the next three years.

Working in child health, what were the main impacts of the Covid-19 pandemic on FJLES ? What and how did it change?

There was a huge impact. We had to adapt the hospital to a new reality and many opportunities arose.



We established several research partnerships, organized seminars to spread quality information, and developed several films and animations for YouTube that reached millions of people.

One of the concerns of our board was to fight hunger. We donated tens of thousands of basic food baskets to families with children all over Brazil during the first two years of the pandemic. The exceptional hunger situation moved us to, take steps outside of our established policies.

What has been the biggest learning from this period?

For me the greatest learning from the pandemic was to see people value our Universal Health System that all Brazilians, without exception, have the right to. Seeing people getting vaccinated, applauding the health and science professionals was the greatest learning.

What aspects of philanthropy do you find most rewarding? Did this work change you as a person? If yes, how?

I see philanthropy as a tool to strengthen civil society. In a country as unequal as Brazil, it is the society's obligation to organize itself and help solve problems, which are enormous, as the State alone will not be able to solve them. It is always gratifying to see a social project bear fruit and help our streets, our neighborhood, our cities, or the country, no matter how big or small.

Working in philanthropy means meeting a great diversity of people, of realities, of thoughts, and this is always transformative if we are open to change. I have certainly changed a lot and I believe that after almost 20 years of dedicating myself to philanthropy, I am a more open person, more aware of inequalities, of differences, and am a better human being.

Do you see any changes needed to Philanthropy? If yes, tell us about what you think needs to change?

I believe that Philanthropy, like everything else in life, evolves. What was practiced in the time of our grandparents is different from what it is today and will be different in the time of my grandchildren. Problems change, and so do the ways of facing life and differences. There is a lot of discussion about this topic in the world. Philanthropy is also practiced differently in different countries and maybe what I say for Brazil is not valid for the rest of the countries, but in general I think that change and adaptation to new times is always welcome.

According to you, which direction should our strategic actions be focused on next?

I believe that the strategic actions for the future in Brazil are for an agenda to reduce inequalities, whether they are economic, racial, regional, gender, and others.

Finally, I believe that we should fight for the construction of a more just society for our grandchildren, destroying a whole structure full of centuries-old prejudices.
